The event started with "Get to Know You Bingo" Icebreaker. The bingo cards had different "get to know you" items in each box and participants had to go around to the group and have them sign the box that corresponded with something about themselves. It was an interactive and fun activity.

After the icebreaker, while lunch was being set up, the group had a few minutes to head to the upper level of the Jonathan Padelford and enjoy the sunshine and scenic view.

Next up to the microphone was CSL Behring advocate speaker, Kim Walsh, from Pittsburg, PA. Kim shared a compelling story of her own experiences growing up with heavy menstrual cycles for long periods of time, and being told it was normal. It wasn't until the age of 35


